Featuring Coats® Secura Heat-activated button thread

Sometimes you just need a little something on your shoulders to add a touch of warmth. This button-trimmed wrap is just what is needed and it adds glamour as well. Make it from yardage or a pre-made fringed stole (shown).

Supplies

- 1 pre-made stole 28" x 72" (71.12cm) x 182.88cm) with fringed ends
- Assorted coordinating buttons
- 1 yd grosgrain ribbon, 7/8" (2.22cm)
- Coats® Secura Heat-Activated button thread or Dual Duty All-purpose thread

Assembling the Wrap

1. Fold the stole lengthwise with right sides together, matching the finished edges. Sew the upper edges together, leaving a neckline opening 15" (38.10cm) from the fold. Stop the shoulder seam stitching at the fringe line. Press this shoulder seam open.
2. Pin the ribbon under the shoulder seam and trim to slightly shorter than the actual seam length.
3. Hand stitch assorted buttons along the shoulder seam, spacing as desired. Stitch through the ribbon so that the ribbon supports the weight of the buttons.
4. Sew a few buttons at the lower front corner of the wrap to provide some weight to hold it in place.
5. If using **Secura**, set iron on a polyester setting and steam the back of the buttons to lock the thread in place.

To Make Wrap from Fabric

The wrap may also be made from fabric:

*2 yd wool or acrylic fabric, 60" (152.40cm)
(This will make two wraps.)

From wool, cut:

1 rectangle, 29" x 72" (73.66cm x 182.88cm)

Narrowly hem the sides and ends of the fabric rectangle and topstitch. Follow above instructions for assembling the wrap.
