



## MATERIALS

### Coats & Clark™ Cotton Machine Quilting Thread

One pre-cut fabric pack containing (42) 5" (13cm) squares\*

1 yd (1m) border fabric

½ yd (46cm) binding fabric

2⅔ yds (2.4m) backing fabric

47" x 51" (119.5cm x 130cm) batting

\*You can also cut your own squares using scraps from other projects.

We used Oz Charm Pack by Sanae by Moda fabrics.



PIECING, QUILTING | SKILL LEVEL: **EASY**

### Featuring Coats & Clark™ Cotton Machine Quilting thread

Pre-cuts save cutting and shopping time, and they're already planned to go together, so no decision making needed, except which pack to buy. These 5" (13cm) squares are ready to sew when you get them, so this quilt sews up lickety-split. And, the best part—it only takes one pack to make (OK, plus borders, binding and backing).

### MEASUREMENTS

39" x 43" (99cm x 109cm)

### CUTTING

#### From the border fabric, cut:

(4) 2¾" x 9½" (7cm x 24cm) inner borders

(4) 2¾" x 23" (7cm x 57cm) middle borders

(2) 4" x 36½" (10cm x 93cm) outer side borders

(2) 4" x 39" (10cm x 99cm) outer top/bottom borders

#### From the binding fabric, cut:

(5) strips, 2 ½" x width of fabric (6.5cm x WOF)

Seam allowances are ¼" (.64cm).

### ASSEMBLING THE QUILT TOP

**Note:** If any of the squares are a directional print, be sure to orient them properly in the quilt. Press block seams open.

1. Lay out the 5" (13cm) squares in a pleasing arrangement following the quilt image for placement. Note that some fabric packs have multiples of the same fabric, so be sure to spread them out, so they don't end up next to each other.
2. Beginning in the middle, sew two center squares together.

**Note:** Press all seam allowances toward the newly added sections during assembly.

3. Sew an inner border side strip to each side of the two-square unit. Then sew an inner border top/bottom strip to the top and another to the bottom of the unit.
4. Continuing to work from the center outward, sew two three-square units together for the sides and two four-square units for the top/bottom.
5. Sew a three-square unit to each side of the step 3 section.
6. Matching adjacent seams, sew a four-square section to the top and the other one to the bottom.
7. Sew a middle border strip to each side of the step 6 unit, and a middle border to the top and the other to the bottom.
8. Sew together a six-square unit for each side of the quilt and two seven-square units for the top/bottom.
9. Sew a six-square unit to each side of the quilt center, then matching adjacent seams, sew a seven-square unit to the top and the other one to the bottom.
10. Sew an outer side border to each side of the quilt center, followed by the outer top and bottom border strips to their respective locations.

### **FINISHING**

1. Layer the backing and batting wrong side up and the quilt top right side up. Pin securely to hold the layers together.
2. Quilt as desired. An easy way to quilt this design is to stitch diagonally from corner to corner on the squares and extend the stitching lines into the borders.
3. Trim the batting and backing to match the quilt top.
4. Sew the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open, then press the binding wrong sides together.
5. Bind the quilt, mitering the binding at the corners.

**Tip:** Need a bigger quilt? Buy another charm pack and keep building outward.
