



## MATERIALS

### Coats & Clark Dual Duty XP® All-purpose Thread

1 ⅛ yds satin (1.03m)

1 ⅓ yds (1.22m) metallic trim, 7⁄8" (2.22cm) wide

1 ¼ yds (1.14m) lace trim with one scalloped edge

### Featuring Coats & Clark Dual Duty XP®

Smooth, silky satin sends you off to slumber in style and comfort. Add a little metallic bling and some sensuous lace and you're off to sweet dreams.

### MEASUREMENTS

20" x 32" (50.80cm x 81.28cm); Fits a standard size pillow

### CUTTING

From the satin, cut:

1 rectangle, 38" x 42" (96.52cm x 106.68cm)

*Seam allowances are ½" (1.27cm)*

### Assemble the Hem

1. Press under ¼" (.64cm) along the long edge of the rectangle. Then press under 5 ½" (13.97cm) along the same edge. Carefully pin the hem in place and stitch along the inside fold.
2. From the right side, pin the lace along the hemmed edge, just slightly extending the scallop over the folded edge.

3. Stitch over the previous stitching line to secure the lace in place. Trim the lace ¼" (.64cm) beyond the stitching line. Sew along both lace ends to secure it to the satin; trim any excess length.
4. Lapping the metallic trim edge over the previous stitching line, pin the trim along the straight lace edge. Sew both edges in place with matching thread.

### Assemble the Pillowcase

1. To make the French seams that neatly finish the inside, fold the pillowcase with wrong sides together, matching the lace ends. Sew the long edge using a scant ¼" (.64cm) seam allowance. Turn the pillowcase right sides together and press the seam. Trim any fabric ravel.



2. With right sides together, sew the seam edge again, this time a full ¼" from the edge, encasing the previously sewn edges. Turn the pillowcase right side out and press the seam edge.
3. Repeat steps 1 and 2 for the pillowcase end.

### **Satin Sewing Tips**

- Satin is squirmy, so pin generously to keep things in place.
- Use a walking foot to keep layers from shifting as you sew.
- Hold the seam layers taut as you sew to help prevent puckers.
- Trim ravel with sharp scissors to keep things neat.
- A small size needle (size 70/10) will prevent visible needle holes.
