Featuring Coats Dual Duty XP®

If you're looking to add a little favor to a Halloween party table, or to hand out as a special treat, this little mummy bag is the perfect answer.

Supplies

- Coats Dual Duty XP® all purpose thread
- 1/8 yd (11.43cm) white felt
- 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" (3.81cm x 8.89cm) lime green felt
- Scrap of black felt
- 1/2 yd (45.72cm) grosgrain ribbon, 3/8" (.95cm) wide
- Paper-back fusible web
- Small plastic spider
- Craft glue
- Decorative-edge scissors or rotary cutter (scallop or pinking blade)

Cutting

From the white felt, cut:

- (2) rectangles, 3½" x 5¼" (8.89cm x 13.34cm)
- (4) strips, 1" x 12" (2.54cm x 30.48cm)

Assembling the Mummy Front

1. Following the manufacturer's instructions, back the green and black felts with fusible web.
2. Cut two black felt ovals about 1¼" x 1" (3.18cm x 2.54cm) for eyes.
3. Fuse the green rectangle to one white rectangle 1½" (3.81cm) from one short edge.
4. Fuse the black ovals over the green rectangle.
5. Trim both edges of the 1" x 12" (2.54cm x 30.48cm) strips using the decorative scissors. Trim the upper back rectangle edge in the same manner.
6. Crisscross the white felt strips across the front rectangle, allowing some of the eyes to show through. Stitch each white strip edge in place as you go. When you reach the upper edge, cut the ribbon in half, center and tuck the end under the top mummy wrap before stitching in place.

Assembling the Treat Bag

7. Center a ribbon on the upper back felt rectangle wrong side and stitch across to hold it in place.
8. With right sides together, match the edges of the front and back. Sew around the sides and lower edge using a ¼" (.64cm) seam. Leave the top open.
9. Turn the bag right side out and press.

Finishing

10. Glue on the spider where desired.
11. Trim the ribbon ends diagonally, fill with candy and tie.
