



MATERIALS

Coats & Clark™ Dual Duty XP™ All-purpose Thread

$\frac{1}{4}$ yd (23cm) each of nine assorted green prints (for blocks and borders)
 $\frac{1}{3}$ yd (30.5cm) white-on-white print
 $\frac{1}{4}$ yd (23cm) binding fabric
 $\frac{7}{8}$ yd (80cm) backing fabric
 $\frac{7}{8}$ yd (80cm) batting
 Clear ruler with a 45° marking

 PIECING, QUILTING | SKILL LEVEL: **EASY**

Featuring Coats & Clark™ All-Purpose Thread

Whether you use it as a table mat or a wall hanging, this fun green quilt brings a breath of spring to your décor. Add some shamrocks or leprechauns and it's the perfect accent for St. Patrick's Day fun. Machine quilt with Coats & Clark™ All-Purpose thread for a fast and easy project.

MEASUREMENTS

24" x 24" (61cm x 61cm)

CUTTING

From the assorted green prints, cut:

(9) pairs of 4" squares (two of each print), for blocks
 (2) strips, 3½" x 18½" (9cm x 47cm) total, for side borders
 (2) strips, 3½" x 24½" (9cm x 62cm) total, for top/bottom borders

From the white-on-white print, cut:

(2) strips, 4" x width-of-fabric (10cm x WOF); sub-cut (18) 4" (10cm) squares

From the binding fabric, cut:

(3) strips, 2¼" x WOF (6cm x WOF)

Seam allowances are ¼" (.64cm).

ASSEMBLING THE PINWHEELS

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each 4" (10cm) white-on-white square.
2. Layer a green print and white print square right sides together with edges matching. Sew ¼" (.64cm) on each side of the drawn line. Repeat for all the squares.
3. Cut the triangles apart on the drawn line and press the seam allowances toward the green fabric. Be careful not to stretch the diagonal seam, as it's on the bias.



4. Align the diagonal seam with the 45° ruler line and trim the blocks to 3½" (9cm) square.
5. Lay out the matching triangle units to form a pinwheel, alternating green and white, in two rows. Sew together two units in each row and press the seam allowances toward the adjacent green triangle.
6. Lay out the matching rows again to form the pinwheel. Matching the middle seam, sew the upper and lower block rows together. Press the seam open.
7. Repeat steps 2-6 to create all nine pinwheel blocks.

Tip: The featured quilt shows each pinwheel block made with matching triangles, but you can also mix and match the triangles within each block for interest.

ASSEMBLING THE QUILT TOP

1. Lay out the pinwheel blocks in three rows of three blocks each. Sew the blocks together in each row, pressing seams in alternate directions for adjacent rows.
2. Matching adjacent seams, sew the three rows together in order. Press the seams in one direction.
3. Sew a side border to each side of the quilt top center, followed by a top and bottom border. Press the seam allowances toward the borders.

FINISHING

1. Layer the backing and batting wrong side up and the quilt top right side up. Pin securely to hold the layers together.
2. Quilt as desired. The featured quilt was stitched in the ditch of the pinwheel squares and the lines extended out through the border.
3. Trim the batting and backing to match the quilt top.
4. Sew the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open, then press the binding wrong sides together.
5. Bind the quilt, mitering the binding at the corners.
