What you will need:

RED HEART® Super Saver®:
1 skein each 373 Petal Pink A, 505
Aruba Sea B, 235 Lemon C, and
668 Honeydew D.

Susan Bates® knitting needles:
5mm [US 8]

Yarn needle

GAUGE: 18 sts = 4" [10 cm]; 32
rows = 4" [10 cm] in Garter st
(knit every row). **CHECK YOUR
GAUGE.** Use any size needles to
obtain the gauge.

Easter Placemats with Napkin Rings

*Create a happy knit table setting that will
make Easter a festive occasion! Napkin rings
feature colorfully striped eggs. Placemats in
an easy basketweave pattern are fun to use
all Spring and Summer long!*

Placemat measures 14" tall x 19" wide
[35.56 cm x 48.26 cm]

Napkin ring measures 2 ½" tall x 6" wide
[6.35 cm x 15.24 cm]

BASKETWEAVE STITCH PATTERN

Rows 1–5: *K4, p4; repeat from * to end.
Rows 6–10: *P4, k4; repeat from * to end.

PLACEMAT (Make 1 A, 1 B, 1 C, and 1 D)

Cast on 64 sts.
Work in Garter st (knit every row) for 4" (10 cm).
Work Basketweave Stitch Pattern for 11"
(28 cm).
Work Garter st (knit every row) for 4" (10 cm).
Cast off. Weave in ends.

NAPKIN RING (Make 4 D)

With D, cast on 24 sts.
Work in Garter st (knit every row) for 3 rows.
Work Basketweave Stitch Pattern for 10 rows.
Work in Garter st (knit every row) for 3 rows.
Cast off. Whip stitch napkin ring edges
together to form a ring.

EGG (optional) (Make 4 A and 4 C)

Starting at bottom of egg, cast on 4 sts.
Row 1: Knit across.
Row 2: Purl across.
Row 3: Inc 1, K2, inc 1—6 sts.
Row 4: Purl across.
Row 5: Knit across.
Row 6: Purl across.
Row 7: [K2tog] twice—4 sts.
Cast off.

FINISHING

With yarn needle, sew one A and one C egg
to each napkin ring. Using photo as a guide,
on A egg, embroider a zigzag st with C and D.
On C egg, embroider a zigzag st with A and D.
Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

A, B, C = Colors A, B, C; inc = increase(s)(d)
(ing); K = knit; P = Purl; st(s) = stitch(es);
K2tog = Knit next 2 sts together.
