Featuring Coats Dual Duty XP®

Scraping ice from your car's windshield is sometimes a necessary evil, but the experience can be improved with this toasty handwarmer attached to the scraper. Just slip your palm inside and scrape away in comfort.

Supplies

- Coats Dual Duty XP® All-purpose thread to match
- ½ yd (45.72cm) fleece
- ¾ yd (34.29cm) sherpa
- ½ yd (45.72cm) grosgrain ribbon, ⅝" (1.59cm)
- Ice scraper with hole in handle

Cutting

From the fleece, cut:

1 rectangle, 13" tall x 16" wide (33.02cm x 40.64cm)

From the sherpa, cut:

2 rectangles, 8" x 12½" (20.32cm x 31.75cm)

Assemble the Mitt

Note: Seam allowance is ¼" (.64cm).

1. Fold the fleece rectangle in half lengthwise to form a tube 8" (20.32cm) wide and 16" (40.64cm) long. Sew the long side seam and across the bottom, leaving a 2" (5.08cm) opening centered on the lower edge. Backstitch on each side of the opening.
2. Sew the long edges of the two sherpa rectangles together and stitch across the bottom leaving the same centered 2" opening in the bottom. Leave a 4" (10.16cm) opening in one side seam to allow for turning.
3. With right sides together, slip the fleece tube inside the sherpa tube, matching one side seam.
4. Sew around the top opening. Turn the mitt right side out, pushing the lining into the fleece mitt. Whipstitch the sherpa side seam opening closed. Turn back the sherpa cuff at the upper edge.
5. Turn under the edges of each bottom opening layer and whipstitch together.

Finishing

1. Slide the ice scraper handle through the lower opening. Pin-mark the handle hole location.
2. Fold the ribbon length in half. Hand-stitch the fold to the sherpa lining at the marked location.
3. Tie the ribbon through the hole in the ice scraper handle to hold it in place.
