What you will need:

**RED HEART® Roll with It
Tweed™:** 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 5) balls
9272 Neon

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook:
8mm [US L-11]

Yarn needle

GAUGE: 7 esc = 4" (10 cm); 8
rows (4 rows of sc and 4 rows
of esc) in pattern = 4" (10
cm). **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.**
Use any size hook to obtain
the gauge.

Easy-to-Wear Cardigan

Choose the shade of this yarn that makes you happiest, and crochet a comfortable sweater to live in every day. It's as easy to wear as it is to crochet!

SHOP KIT

Directions are for size Small. Changes for sizes Medium, Large, Extra Large, 2X Large, and 3X Large are in parentheses.

Cardigan measures 37 (41, 45, 49, 53, 57)" (94 (104, 114.5, 124.5, 134.5, 145) cm) around bust and 32½" (82.5 cm) in length.

NOTES

1. Row gauge is more important than stitch gauge for this pattern.
2. Cardigan body is worked lengthwise from left side to right side. Sleeves and collar are then worked onto the body.

SPECIAL STITCH

Esc (extended single crochet) = Pull up a loop in indicated st, yo and draw through one loop only forming a chain st, yo and draw through both loops on hook.

CARDIGAN

Ch 115.

Row 1 (right side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end, turn - 114 sc.

Row 2: Ch 2 (counts as first esc), esc in each sc to end, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each esc to end, turn.

Next 14 (16, 18, 20, 22, 24) rows: Repeat rows 2 and 3 alternately.

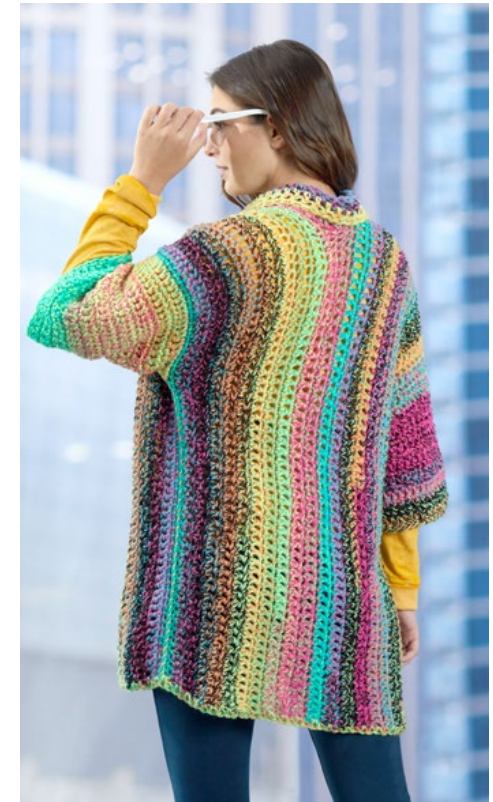
Front Opening

Next 5 rows:

Row 1 (wrong side): Ch 1, sc in each of first 61 sc (sc, ch 1) in next sc (counts as first esc), esc in each sc to end - 61 sc and 53 esc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of first 53 esc, leave remaining sts unworked, turn - 53 sc.

Row 3: Ch 2 (counts as first esc), esc in each sc to end, turn - 53 esc.



Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each esc to end, ch 62, turn - 53 sc and 62 ch.

Row 5: Skip 2 ch (counts as 1 esc), esc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch and sc to end, turn - 114 esc.

Work 16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 26) more rows in pattern across all sts.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

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Sleeve

Fold piece in half. Matching up sts of last row, sew 38 sts together for side seam from the corner inward, leaving center 38 sts open for armhole. With wrong side facing, join yarn with slip st in any st at armhole edge.

Round 1: Ch 2 (counts as 1 esc), esc in each st around armhole opening, join with slip st in beginning ch-2, turn - 38 esc.

Round 2: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join with slip st in first sc, turn.

Round 3: Ch 2 (counts as 1 esc), esc in each st around, join with slip st in beginning ch-2, turn.

Rounds 4-19: Repeat Rounds 2 and 3 alternately.

Round 20: Repeat Round 2. Fasten off.

Work second side seam and Sleeve the same way.

Collar

With right side facing, join yarn with slip st in first st at bottom corner of right front.

Row 1 (right side): Slip st very loosely in each of next 9 sts, sc in each of next 10 sts, hdc in each of next 20 sts, dc in each of next 11 sts, [2 dc in next st, dc in next st] 5 times, 2 dc in next st, working in row ends across back of neck, 2 dc in each of next 3 rows, [2 dc in next st, dc in next st] 6 times, dc in each of next 10 sts, hdc in each of next 20 sts, sc in each of next 10 sts, slip st very loosely in each of last 10 sts, turn - 142 sts.

Rows 2 - 5: Slip st very loosely in each slip st, sc in each sc, hdc in each hdc, dc in each dc, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in each st to end. Do not turn; do not fasten off.

Bottom Edging

Row 1 (wrong side): Ch 1, working in row ends, sc in last row, skip next 2 rows, sc in next row, skip next 2 rows, sc in each row to last 6 rows (collar rows), [skip next 2 rows, sc in next row] twice. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in all loose ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain; **dc** = double crochet; **hdc** = half double crochet; **sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **yo** = yarn over; **[]** = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; *** or **** = repeat whatever follows the * or ** as indicated.
