What you will need:

RED HEART® Heart & Sole®: 4 balls 3800 Blue

Susan Bates® Knitting Needles: 5mm [US 8]

Yarn needle, fork

GAUGE: 15 sts = 4" (10 cm);
26 rows = 6" (15 cm) in Mesh
st, after blocking. **CHECK
YOUR GAUGE.** Use any size
needles to obtain the gauge
given.



RED HEART® Heart & Sole®, Art E840
available in 1.76 oz
(50 g) 187 yds (171 m) balls

Pompom Knit Scarf

Try this fascinating mesh stitch to create a knit scarf that spans the seasons. We love the addition of small pom-pom trios at the corners for the perfect finishing touch!

Scarf measures 12 x 72" (30.5 x 183 cm) after blocking.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Ssk (slip, slip, knit) = Slip next 2 sts knitwise to right needle, insert point of left needle through front of sts, knit these sts together through back loop.

MESH STITCH

(Worked over a multiple of 2 sts + 1)

Rows 1-3: Knit.

Row 4 (right side): K1, * yo, k2tog; repeat from * across.

Rows 5-7: Knit.

Row 8 (right side): * Ssk, yo; repeat from * to last st, k1.

Repeat Rows 1-8 for Mesh st.

SCARF

Cast on 45 sts.

Work in Mesh st until piece measures 72" (183 cm), ending after a Row 3 or a Row 7.

Bind off all sts loosely knitwise.

FINISHING

Pompoms-on-a-Fork
(make 12; 3 for each corner)

1. Cut two ½ yd (.46) pieces of yarn and place between center prongs of fork.

2. Cut an 8 yd (7.3m) piece of yarn and wrap around fork prongs.



3. Using the ½ yd (.46m) pieces, tie tightly around the wraps and knot.

4. Slip wraps off of fork and cut the loops on both sides of tie.



5. Trim pom-pom to give it a round shape.



6. Using overhand knot, tie 2 pompoms together about an inch above top of pompoms
7. Tie third pom-pom to the knot. Use 4 strands to tie to corner of scarf and trim other strands even with pom-pom. Weave in all loose ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit; **k2tog** = knit next 2 sts together; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **yo** = yarn over; * **or** ** = repeat whatever follows the * or ** as indicated.
