What you will need:
RED HEART ${ }^{\star}$ Super Saver ${ }^{\text {® }}$ : 8 skeins \#4381 Sutherland Stripe

Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ Crochet Hook: 5.5 mm [US I-9].

Yarn needle
GAUGE: Rows $1-6=4^{\prime \prime}(10$ cm); 1 Block = $11^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}(28 \times 28$ cm ). CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## BUY YARN

RED HEART ${ }^{\text {s }}$ Super Saver ${ }^{\circledR}$, Art. E300 available in solid color 7 oz (198 g), 364 yds ( 333 m ); stripes, prints, multis and heathers 5 oz (141 g), 236 yds ( 215 m ); flecks 5 oz (141 g), 260 yds ( 238 m ) skeins


## Sutherland Throw

This self-striping shade of Super Saver ${ }^{\circledR}$ frees you from the time-consuming task of weaving in ends for each color change. The mitered squares are perfect for showing off the restful Sutherland colorway. If you'd like more of a color pop throw, there are brighter

Super Saver Stripes ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ shades available.

Afghan measures 48" wide x 60" long ( $122 \times 152.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ ).

## Notes

1. Blocks are mitered squares worked back and forth in turned rows across 2 edges.
2. 2 chains are worked in each row. Beginning in Row 3, work 2 double crochet in each chain in all oddnumbered rows; beginning in Row 4 and in all even-numbered rows, work 2 sets of 2 double crochet in the chain-2 space.

## THROW

Block (make 20)
Ch 4.
Row 1 (right side): 5 dc in 4 th ch from hook (beginning skipped ch count as first dc), turn-6 dc.
Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc, dc in top of beginning ch, turn-8 dc and 2 ch .
Row 3: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in each st across to next $2 \mathrm{ch}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in first ch, ch 2, 2 dc in next ch, dc in each remaining st across, working last dc in top of beginning ch, turn-12 dc and 1 ch-2 space
Row 4: Ch 3, dc in each st across to ch-2 space, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in ch-2 space, dc in each remaining st across, working last dc in top of beginning ch, turn-16 dc and 2 ch.
Rows 5-16: Repeat Rows 3 and 4 six times-64 dc and 2 ch
Fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Refer to photograph for placement of pieces. With right sides facing, arrange Blocks in 5 rows of 4 Blocks across, positioning all Blocks with Row 1 at lower right-hand corner. With wrong sides held together, whipstitch Blocks together to form rows, then sew strips of rows together.

## Border

Round 1: With right side facing and working in ends of rows, join yarn with slip st in first row at top corner, ch 1, 3 sc in same row, [evenly space 30 sc across each Block to row 1 at outer corner of last Block, 3 sc in row 1] 3 times, evenly space 30 sc across each Block to first sc; join with slip st in first sc-540 sc and four 3 -sc corners.
Round 2: Ch 3, 3 dc in next sc (center sc of first 3-sc corner), [dc in each sc across to center st of next 3-sc corner, 3 dc in center st] 3 times, dc in each remaining sc to beginning ch; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-548 dc and four 3-dc corners.
Round 3: Ch 1, sc in same st as join, [sc in each dc around to center st of next 3 -dc corner, 3 sc in center st] 4 times, sc in each remaining dc to first sc; join with slip st in first sc-556 sc and four 3-sc corners.
Round 4: (Ch 3, 2 dc ) in first sc, [skip next 2 sc, (slip st, ch 3, 2 dc) in next sc ] around to last 2 sc , skip last 2 sc ; join with slip st in top of beginning ch. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends

## ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain(s); dc = double crochet; sc = single crochet; $\boldsymbol{s t}(\mathbf{s})=$ stitch(es); ( ) = work directions in parentheses into same st; * = repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.
