



## 9/Happy Hands Fingerless Gloves

### Size:

One size fits M/L, 6 1/2" [16.5 cm] circumference at widest part of hand

### Finished Measurements:

7 1/2" x 6 1/2" [19 x 16.5 cm]

**Yarn Requirements:** Sugar Bush Itty-Bitty (shown in 5013 Whisper White)

1 ball

### Knitting Needle Requirements:

US 3 (3.25 mm) **or size needed to obtain gauge**

**Abbreviations:** see page 3

### Materials:

Yarn needle

### Gauge:

27 sts and 37 rows = 4" [10 cm] in Lace pattern.

### Stitch Glossary:

**(yo)p2(yo)** = Two yarn overs are created before and after the p2 stitches by simply leaving the yarn at the back after working the pssso, complete the purl stitches and continue with the yarn in front for the next stitch.

**K1b** = Insert needle into the stitch

directly below the next stitch on the LH needle.

Wrap and knit as you normally would.

Knit the stitch on the LH needle.

**Lace Trellis** (multiple of 11 sts + 3)

**Row 1:** S1. \*K1. K1b. K1. yo. S1. K2tog.

pssso. (yo)p2(yo). S1. K2tog. pssso. yo.

Repeat from \* to last 2 sts. K2.

**Row 2:** Purl except knit the Row 1 purl stitches.

**Row 3:** Knit the row except purl the purl stitches.

**Row 4:** Repeat Row 2.

**Note:** If you cannot complete a full multiple, knit the stitches.

### Optional Beading:

**Row 1:** A bead can be placed on the k1b of each lace repeat. To do this, place the stitch back on the left needle, insert a piece of fire wire through the stitch to be beaded, place a bead over the 2 ends of the fire wire and slip the bead onto the stitch, transfer the stitch to the left needle, knit the stitch to complete.

**INSTRUCTIONS**

**BACK AND FRONT**

Using long tail cast on 47 sts.

**Create edge** - Purl 3 rows, followed by a knit row and one more purl row.

Start the Lace Trellis pattern. Work until piece measures 4" [10 cm] from beginning.

**Helpful tip:** Slip the first stitch of every row. This makes a nice finish for the thumb opening.

**Thumb decrease** - Decrease 1 st at each end on every purl row for the next 6 rows. 41 sts. **Note:** Keep the lace pattern consistent during decreases. Always try to balance the yo with the k2tog. When this is not possible, knit or purl the stitches as appropriate. Complete the glove cuff.

**Glove cuff:**

Continue to slip the first stitch of each row. Establish a k2, p2 ribbing.

Complete 3" [7.5 cm] before casting off loosely.

**FINISHING**

Sew up side seam of cuff capturing up to the start of the thumb decreases. With right sides together, pick up the slipped stitch along the edges using a mattress stitch. Sew 1 1/2" [4 cm] to 2" [5 cm] together from the top of the glove, leaving the remaining open for the thumb.

k2(3)tog = knit next 2 (3) stitches together

M1 = make 1 st by picking up horizontal loop lying before next st and knitting into back of loop

p = purl

p2tog = purl next 2 stitches together

p2togtbl = purl next 2 stitches together through back loops

pat = pattern

pm = place marker

psso = pass slipped stitch over

rem = remain/remaining

rep = repeat

rnd(s) = round(s)

RS = right side

sc = single crochet

sk = skip

skd = skipped

sl = slip

sl st = slip stitch

sl1 = slip 1 stitch

slk = slip next stitch knitwise

slp = slip next stitch purlwise

sm = slip marker

sp = space

ssk = slip 2 sts knitwise, one at a time, insert left needle into front of these 2 stitches, then knit them together through the back loops

St st = stockinette stitch

st(s) = stitch(es)

tbl = through back loop(s)

tog = together

WS = wrong side

yfwd = yarn forward

yo = yarn over

## STITCH GLOSSARY

Garner St = knit every row. (Rnds – knit 1 rnd, purl 1 rnd.)

Stockinette st = (Rows) knit on RS, purl on WS. (Rnds – knit every rnd.)

Reverse stockinette st = (Rows) purl on RS, knit on WS. (Rnds – purl every rnd.)
