What you will need:

RED HEART® Unforgettable®: 3 balls 3952 Tealberry

KB Loom: All-n-One Loom, 106 pegs

Notions: Knitting tool, tapestry needle, scissors, crochet hook.

Gauge: 11sts x 13 rows = 4 inches (10 cm). Exact gauge is not essential for this project.



Harvest Lace Shawl

Wrap yourself in the softness of this colorful shawl. You'll love wearing it for casual or dressy occasions. Knit on a loom, this roving yarn displays beautiful color combinations.

SHOP KIT

SIZE: One Size: shawl measurements approximately 84" x 26" (213 x 66 cm) when blocked.

SPECIAL STITCHES

m1: Work stitches to end of row as directed in pattern, take the working yarn to the front between the last worked peg and the next empty peg on the loom. Wrap the working yarn clockwise around the empty peg creating a new loop. Turn and work the next row in pattern, starting with the last stitch worked in the previous row.

ewrap: Wrap yarn around peg.

Eyelet Row: Eyelets are worked over 2 stitches.

Step 1: Place stitches from peg 2 onto peg 1, untwist the ewrap if needed to give enough slack.

Step 2: Knit (flat stitch) the stitch on peg one, making sure to lift both strands over.

Step 3: Ewrap peg 2.

Step 4: Move to the next set of pegs and repeat as directed in pattern.

Untwist the ewraps prior to working row 23, this makes the eyelets defined.

k2tog: Knit two stitches together. Take the last stitch in the row from its peg and place it together with the loop one stitch in from the end. Knit both loops over together as one.

NOTE: Knit stitches in pattern are worked as ewrap unless otherwise noted.

SHAWL

Set the knitting loom to have at 94 pegs available. Setting the loom to its full amount of pegs is best to allow for a gap between the

end of the row and beginning in section 2. Pattern is written so that row 1 is worked left to right across loom, and row 2 is worked right to left.

Cast on 4 stitches

SECTION 1

Row 1: Knit to end of row

Row 2: Slip 1, purl to last stitch in row, m1 Repeat rows 1 and 2 10 times ending with a purl row.

Row 21: Slip 1, knit to end of row.

Row 22: Work eyelet row.

Row 23: Slip 1, knit to end of row.

Repeat these 23 rows until there are 94 stitches on the loom.

SECTION 2

Row 1: Slip 1, knit to end of row

Row 2: Slip 1, purl to last stitch in row, k1. Repeat rows 1 and 2 10 times ending with a purl row.

Row 21: Slip 1, knit to end of row.

Row 22: Work eyelet row.

Row 23: Slip 1, knit to end of row.

Repeat these 23 rows 5 times.

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SECTION 3

Row 1: K2tog, knit to the end of the row.

Row 2: Slip 1, purl to last stitch in row.

Repeat rows 1 and 2 10 times ending with a purl row.

Row 21: Slip 1, knit to end of row.

Row 22: Work eyelet row.

Row 23: Slip 1, knit to end of row.

Repeat these 23 rows until there are 4 stitches on the loom.

Weave ends in. Block as desired.

FINISHING

For optional fringe: Cut 138 strands of yarn 8 inches long. Holding 6 strands of yarn together, fold them in half over the end of the crochet hook. Push crochet hook through bottom eyelet in first eyelet row and pull the ends of fringe yarn through the shawl and the fringe loop. Tug lightly to secure.

Continue placing strands of fringe at the end of each eyelet row across the entire shawl.

Trim as needed to make fringe even.
