What you will need:

RED HEART® Loop-it™: 1 ball
441 Gray-vv

Sewing thread and needle

GAUGE: Gauge is not critical
for this project.



**RED HEART®
Loop-it™, Art E884**
available in 3.5 oz
(100 g) 7.6 yr (7 m) balls

Finger Looping Wristers

You don't need to know how to knit
to finger loop these warm wristers!

You only need one ball of Loop-it
yarn, making this a budget-friendly
addition to your cold weather accessory
collection. No needles or hooks needed!

**Wrister measures 8½" [21.5 cm]
circumference x 8" [20.5 cm] long.**

NOTES

Begin work on a flat surface. Stitches
are worked by pulling loops of yarn
through a round of previous loops.
Wristers are worked in continuous
rounds with right side facing
throughout.

WRISTER (make 2)

To create base round, start with a length
of 13 loops.

Round 1 (Right Side): Working from
right to left, pull loops of working yarn
through first loop of base round loop
working from back to front, to create a
ring, continue to pull loops of working
yarn through loops of base round until
all loops have been worked - knit round
formed.

Rounds 2-4: Working from right to
left, pull loops of working yarn through
loops of previous round loops working
from back to front - 13 sts.

Shape Thumb Hole

Note: Thumb Hole is worked in rows.

Row 5 (thumb hole): Without turning
work and working from left to right, pull
loops of working yarn through loops of
previous round loops working from back
to front. Do Not Turn.

Row 6: Without turning work and
working from right to left, pull loops of
working yarn through loops of previous
round loops working from back to front.
Do Not Turn.

Shape Wrister

Note: Remainder of Wrister is worked in
rounds.

Rounds 7-8: Working from right to
left, pull loops of working yarn through
loops of previous row/round loops
working from back to front - 13 sts.

Bind off

Working across, pull the first two loops
of working yarn through first 2 loops
of previous row, pull the second loop
just worked through the first loop, pull
a third loop of working yarn through
next stitch, pull that loop through the
previous loop. Continue in this manner
across the row until all stitches have
been secured. Pull end through last loop.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. (You can tack ends
down with sewing thread to help
camouflage them in the back of the
work).

ABBREVIATIONS

cm = centimeters; **st(s)** = stitch(es).
