



MATERIALS

Coats & Clark™ Dual Duty XP™ All-Purpose Thread

Coats & Clark™ Bold Hand Quilting Thread

Red Heart® Tassel and Pom Maker

Red Heart® Super Saver Yarn, Black

1¾ yds (1.60m) plaid flannel, 60" (152.40cm)*

1¾ yds (1.60m) plush knit fabric, 60" (152.40cm)

Spring clips

Walking foot (optional)

****It's a good idea to pre-shrink the flannel.***

 SEWING, HAND STITCHING | SKILL LEVEL: **EASY**

Featuring Coats & Clark™ Bold Hand Quilting Thread

Cuddle up in front of a holiday fire with this plush-backed flannel throw. Hand-stitch the layers together around the edge and add pom poms to the corners for a fun accent.

MEASUREMENTS

58" x 62" (147.32cm x 157.48cm)

CUTTING

From both the flannel and plush: Square up the fabrics if needed and trim off selvages. Both fabric rectangles should be the same size.

Seam allowances are ½" (1.27cm).

ASSEMBLE THE THROW

Note: Sewing flannel to plush is tricky--hold the layers together with spring clips or long pins. Use a walking foot for more even feeding and a ½" (1.27cm) seam allowance to minimize shifting.

1. Place the flannel and plush right sides together, matching the cut edges. Secure with spring clips on all edges.

2. Sew around the perimeter of the throw, leaving open 8" (20.32cm) on one end for turning.
3. Turn the throw right side out through the opening. Turn under the opening edges and hand-stitch closed.
4. Do not press the edges as plush fabric can be damaged. Instead, use the spring clips around the perimeter to hold the layers even at the edges.

FINISHING

1. Lay the throw flat on a large surface and smooth the layers in place. Following the plaid lines and using Bold Hand Quilting Thread, sew a line of big stitches around the perimeter through both layers about 2" (5.08cm) from the edges.

2. If desired, add additional lines of stitching through the centers, but don't overquilt it—it's meant to be a drapable, cuddly throw.



POM POMS

1. Using Red Heart Pom & Tassel tool, make 4 fluffy pom poms 4" long. Slip a 10" piece of yarn through the top loop. Thread the ends through a darning needle. Slip the needle through the point of the corner of the throw and pull the yarn through the fabric. Tie the ends together to secure the pom pom.
